- 2. Overcomes temptation "... "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God.'..." Lk 4:1-12
- 3. Stays tuned in with His Father Luke 5:16 "So He Himself often withdrew into the wilderness and prayed." (Jn 5:19; Jn 8:29)
- 4. To His disciples, Jesus has a mysterious source of strength "... Lk 11:1-4 ... "When you pray, say: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name..."
- 5. Finishes what He began Lk 22:41-42 "... "Father, if it is Your will, take this cup away from Me; nevertheless not My will, but Yours, be done."

- B. Saying your request perfectly or being better than someone else Lk 18:9-14 "... "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. ... 'God I thank Thee I am not like other men' ... 'God be merciful to me a sinner' ..."

    - 1. Follow the Leader: Luke 11:2 So He said to them, "When you pray, say:
    - 2. God is our: "... Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name."— Righteousness; Sanctifier; Peace; Door; Bread; ...
    - 3. God can be trusted: Luke 11:3 Give us day by day our daily bread.
    - 4. God is present in all: Luke 11:4 "And forgive us our sins, for we also forgive everyone who is indebted to us. And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one."
  - C. We are asking, seeking, knocking Lk 11:5-10
    - 1. Luke 11:5 "... 'Friend, lend me three loaves; 6 for a friend of mine has come to me on his journey, and I have nothing to set before him'; ... 6 "... I have nothing to set before him ..." 7 ... "do not trouble me ..."
    - 2. Lk 11:8 I say to you, though he will not rise and give to him because he is his friend, yet because of his persistence he will rise and give him as many as he needs.
