B. Luke 22:1 Now the Feast of Unleavened Bread drew near, which is called Passover. ... 8 And He sent Peter and John, saying, "Go and prepare the Passover for us, that we may eat." ... 15 Then He said to them, "With

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fervent desire I have desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer; ... 19 And He took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me." ... 20 Likewise He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you.
