Global Street Outreach Protocol: THINGS TO REMEMBER ABOUT STREET MINISTRY:

- 1. SMILE & be UP, sharing the love of the Father is FUN!
- 2. Use a pleasant but normal tone of voice.
- **3.** Our words should be everyday vernacular, be YOU!
- **4.** Make eye contact with a smile.
- **5.** In the inner city, greet folks by saying, 'How ya doin'?
- **6.** It's OK to pray with your eyes open.
- **7.** When partnering 2 by 2, agree on who will lead each encounter so that there is a clear understanding about who is going to lead out.
- **8.** Through eye contact, be aware of your partner to see if they are picking up something and want to pray. Each person will pick up different things about the person being prayed for.
- 9. Always ask permission to put a hand on someone.
- **10.** Take note of any visual signs as you pray, in the way a person looks, moves or feels.
- 11. The person we are praying for can use their hands to make a 'point of faith contact' with a part of their body that needs healing instead of us perhaps making them uncomfortable depending where in their body they are suffering.
- **12.** Do not give out personal information but have an invitation to your church that people can take with them.
- **13.** Most IMPORTANT: When beginning to pray, ALWAYS invite Holy Spirit to come!!!
- **14.** DON'T Be afraid to pause when praying for someone to allow Holy Spirit to touch them.
- **15.** Before concluding an encounter with someone, ALWAYS ask if they got anything from your prayer, did they feel anything, was there any change in a physical or emotional condition they might have had.
- **16.** Never say anything that could be misunderstood as criticism. If you pick something up in the negative like unforgiveness, anger, fear or an unholy attitude, FLIP IT GOOD or DIG for GOLD by relaying the positive instead of the negative. (give a couple of examples)
- **17.** Always seek to understand the person you are ministering to first before being understood. If they want to share, make sure you are listening intently with one hear to Holy Spirit.

Be ready:

Always be ready to **lead someone to Jesus** by asking one or more of the following questions:

- What's your relationship with Jesus like?
- Do you know Him?
- Is your relationship with God the way it should be?
- Do you want to make Jesus Lord of your life?

A GREAT SEGUE into a salvation moment could be asking one of these questions: Do you feel our encounter was an accident? Could this be a divine appointment? Do you know the person that just healed you? Are you feeling anything like peace, heat, tingling or electricity? That's the Holy Spirit...would you like more?

Salvation Prayer Points:

Four Keys to include in a SIMPLE Salvation Prayer when leading someone to Jesus. (We are not selling fire insurance but introducing people to Jesus, their Creator.)

- 1. Acknowledge that Jesus really did suffer on the Cross for their sins and that God raised Him from the dead. Romans 10:9
- 2. Have them ask for forgiveness of ALL sin then thank God for His mercy. 1 John 1:9
- 3. Ask Jesus to take over their life by being their Lord and Savior. Col. 2:6
- 4. Thank the Father that they now belong to Him and that they will forever be in the family of God. Gal 3:26

10 WAYS TO 'CROSS THE CHICKEN LINE'

- 1. Engage in Fake Shopping to pray for an employee. (to avoid getting kicked out of a mall & to appear 'normal' & look for opportunities when they are idle and unoccupied. Never take up an employee's time when another customer approaches.) Examples: What is your top seller? Are you running any sales or specials? Do you like working here? If we give a store employee the opportunity to share with us about their business, THEN we now have some 'change' due to us for listening.
- 2. Sometimes Jesus/God tells me things that He really likes about people and I feel like He's telling me something amazing about you. Would you like to hear it?
- 3. Hey, I just took a course on giving encouraging words. Can I practice on you? Tell me what you really think?
- 4. When was the last time somebody prayed for you? My church is out praying for people today, can I pray for you?
- 5. Hey, how's everything going today? Are you alright? Really alright?
- 6. Sometimes God tells me things about people and He's being repeating the same thing about you. Can I share it with you?
- 7. Have you every heard that God love's you? I mean have you ever heard that He's crazy in love with you?
- 8. Hey, are you doing alright today? Are you having pain anywhere? Can I pray for you?
- 9. This might sound a little crazy but sometimes I just know things about people and I think I know something about you. Would you want to know what it is?
- 10. Try to get a conversation going by making a comment about: the weather, the store, the season, busy-ness, etc...

Always conclude with sharing that God loves them very much and that it was an honor to pray for them. Always leave someone feeling loved, honored and respected. **HOW TO ORGANIZE A GROUP OUTREACH** (don't wait on a church leader)

There are multiple ways to have a group outreach:

- Food & Beverage giveaways especially inner city & homeless hang outs are always effective in breaking the ice and making friends
- Set up a booth at a New Age & Witches Festivals / Give Spiritual Words, Tatoo & Dream Interpretation
- Access Public Car Wash and pay for people's car wash, have church members wash the cars so that the passengers can have free food/beverages and receive prayer
- Access Public Laundromat and pay for washing machines and dryers, have church members wash customers clothes so that they can have free food/beverages and receive prayer
- Access a gas station to pump customer's gas & wash their windshields for the opportunity to pray for them
- Court Houses are great places to pray for people waiting for trial, law enforcement personnel, para-legals and lawyers
- Public parks, shopping centers, fairs, festivals and concerts
- Muslims and Buddhists are usually very open to pray
- There are a LOT of hurting people out there desperate for prayer...we live in a target rich environment!!!
- Treasure Hunt.

10 STEPS IN ORGANIZING AN OUTREACH

Step 1: Identify and equip those that have a heart for street ministry & make them Outreach Leaders.

Step 2: Ask Holy Spirit what kind of Outreach He wants to do.

Step 3: After prayerfully planning the day/time/place for the outreach, the Pastoral leadership can encourage your Outreach Leaders to recruit.

- **Step 4:** Utilize your Outreach Leaders to lead groups of 10-12 people, enough to fit in 2 cars for easy traveling and for cultivating relationships.
- **Step 5:** Encourage those that have committed to an Outreach to beginning writing down Words of Knowledge, prophecies & significant places or people that He wants to highlight in advance. (treasure hunt)
- **Step 6:** Plan at least a 30 minute meeting time for everyone to come together to pray, organize and to pair up in 2's. 3 or more people praying for one person is too intimidating. Luke 10:1
- **Step 7:** The Pastoral leadership can schedule a 'Check In' break with each team in the middle of the outreach to access how people are doing which would be facilitated by the outreach leaders. For those that are struggling, pair them up with someone who is confident and strong in street ministry.
- **Step 8:** VERY IMPORTANT: Always schedule a report back time preferably over a meal at the end of each outreach for people to give Glory to God and to give testimonies about what He did through them. (do not skip this step)
- **Step 9:** When traveling to the Outreach, 'warm-up' by prophesying over each other & to see if Holy Spirit gives anymore Words of Knowledge or Prophecies.
- **Step 10:** Street ministry should be a time of equipping where one person who feels more confident will encourage someone who might be less confident by rotating with them as they feel comfortable.

A note about children: 1 or 2 well behaved children accompanying 2 people sharing on the street can be a great benefit in providing instant favor and genuineness. It also will be a great way to activate them for a lifestyle of outreach in their own lives.
